### Learning relating to Care for our Common Home: Think Talk Create

A focus for the whole school this past term has been the development of Pou Māori, with each class developing their own designs to represent a story from our local area. We look forward to its unveiling at the start of Term 3.

This term Rooms 7, 8 and 12 have been learning about Caring for our Common Home through the topics of Flower Power and Past and Present. The students have been growing plants from seeds and wondering about pollination and caring for God's Creations.

By learning about our school and Miramar history the students can appreciate that these places are special to our community and that we have a responsibility as guardian's for their future. Thank you for all the whanau support in making our trips into Miramar a success and sharing your family history. It was a significant part of helping the children appreciate the treasures from the past.





Discovery Time on a Wednesday afternoon has been a source of great excitement for the Junior Syndicate to practice their Key Competency Skills and revisit the language from the term 1 IOL topics. ## Kaitiaki Leadership:

McAuley Syndicate were very fortunate to be able to attend two special sessions of the Docs for Schools festival at the Roxy Theatre - Naledi: A Baby Elephant's Tale' and 'Slowing Down Fast Fashion' both fitted beautifully into our theme for this year of 'Care for our Common Home'. A major focus for the Year 7 and 8s this term has been topic 'I am Sacred ... Made in the Image of God' where students have learned how they can take care of themselves and others as they begin their teenage years with students also developing their understanding of their own personal mihi. Our attention now turns to the school camp in week 8 of Term 3 - our sincere thanks to all those who have supported our fundraising efforts so far.

### **Garden to Table**

Powerful learning has continued for the students in Years 4-6 who are part of the Garden to Table programme. Each week our students spend time in the kitchen developing their cooking skills and culinary knowledge or in the garden developing an extensive knowledge of gardening and the world around us. We are most grateful to our garden and kitchen coordinators and the volunteers who so generously give of their time.

Key areas of focus: Room 6 have been learning about insects that live in our garden and the part they play in the ecosystem of our environment. Students have ended the term with an exciting visit to Te Papa which has included input sessions relating to Matariki and exploring the invertebrates.

Building on their learning from the garden, Rooms 5 and 1 have explored the aspects of endangered species in a wider context of the world. Students in these classes have ended the term with an overnight camp at the zoo. They have all completed research which is
