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Goal 2: Ako & Learning

To actively involve ākonga/learners in purposeful and accessible learning opportunities.

Expected outcomes for ākonga:

- Development of strong foundational skills.
- Enthusiastic about learning.
- Improved literacy and numeracy levels.
- Willingness to try new things.
- Full participation.
- Opportunities to spend time in nature / learn about the environment.
- Learning in the community.
- Know and experience Mātauranga Māori and the benefit of this knowledge system.

Expected outcomes for whānau:

- Know the pathways tamariki need to take in their learning and can support their progress through these.
- Know the importance for tamariki to be present at school to make the most of learning.

Expected outcomes for kaiako and kaiāwhina kaiako:

- Understand the barriers that may prevent ākonga from accessing, participating or remaining engaged in schooling - work to address barriers.
- Deliver robust, effective and inclusive learning programmes.
- Adjust learning opportunities to ensure all have access.

- Ka Hikitia- Māori are free from racism, discrimination and stigma in education. Māori learners and whānau have identified racism as a major barrier in our education system. We will address this, provide equitable access to services, and in ways that promote fairness and are respectful and culturally appropriate, so that Māori learners and their whānau have a strong sense of belonging.

- Participation in professional development opportunities that develop skills and knowledge in te reo me tikanga Māori.
- Correct pronunciation of te reo Māori.
- Differentiation of tasks for diverse learners.
