Garden to Table:

Garden to Table provides teaching and learning opportunities linked to every aspect of the New Zealand Curriculum. The incredible learning experiences of our students has been reflected in two awards presented to Holy Cross Students in 2018.

Holy Cross School Runners-up in Wellington semi final Root-to Tip - creative cooking competition that a encourages kids to create menus and recipes that incorporate resourceful use of vegetables and fruits that are seasonal and produce minimal waste.

Holy Cross School, had four finalists in the T&G and Garden To Table Young Gardener of the Year Competition. Josh Angelo was one of five very special young gardeners from around NZ to walk away with the coveted title of 2018 Young Gardener of the Year.

Kaitiaki Leadership and William Pike Challenge Awards

This year all of our Year 7 and 8 students were supported to complete the William Pike Challenge Award. The William Pike Challenge Award is a *structured*, *specialist year-long programme* designed for teachers to foster personal development in Year 7 and 8 students.

It includes the completion of 5 outdoor activities, 20 hours community service and 20 hours passion projects.

Our students experienced amazing opportunities thanks to the hard work of their teachers, the support of the Board of Trustees and local people, businesses and organisations.


LOOKING AHEAD TO 2019
