# A few reminders

## ROAD SAFETY:

Next week is Road Safety Week, and we will be sending home a TIPS sheet for you to complete with your child(ren), inviting you to revise road safety around the school. Please make the time to work through this with your child and please be very mindful of others when dropping off or picking up children here at school.

## CONCERNS

At Holy Cross we aim to maintain honest and open channels of communication. If you have a concern or problem regarding your child the following process is to be followed, firstly, speak with your child's class teacher. If the problem persists make an appointment to speak with the Deputy Principal of your child's

syndicate. If the problem is still not resolved, make an appointment to speak with the principal.
