## CATHOLIC CHARACTER

Last week we invited you to pray the Lord's Prayer, to research and think about the meaning of the words in this prayer and the message they give to us.

In the Lord's Prayer, we praise and glorify God and petition (ask) God for what we need. The petition in the Lord's Prayer to give us our **daily bread** has several layers of meaning. The most obvious is to express our need for food. We hunger for food, but we also hunger for peace, we hunger for equality, we hunger for justice for all. To ask for our daily bread is to **ask that our hungers be satisfied—all of them**. Another layer of meaning is added on to the petition by requesting not food but **bread**. Bread is the most basic of foods, so that in asking for bread, we are asking that our **most basic needs be provided**. To ask for bread, then, can be understood as a request that all our basic needs be met—the **needs for shelter, food, clothing, and health care. It is a petition for human dignity**. In this prayer there are two aspects of forgiveness, we are called to forgive the hurts of others as we have received this same forgiveness from God.

We invite you to pray this beautiful prayer with deeper thought and understanding.

who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy name;

Give us this day our daily bread;  
and forgive us our trespasses



## Rhubarb and Kiwifruit Icecream by Tsion Medhane and Rebecca Zhu

### Equipment:

- 2-quart saucepan
- Container that will be enough for the ice cream
- Measurements cups teaspoons and tablespoons.
- Deep Freezer
- Stove
- 20 spoons for tasting
- Knife & Chopping board
- Lemon juicer

### Ingredients

- ¾ cups fresh rhubarb (small diced)
- ¾ cup fresh gold kiwifruit
- ¾ cups Caster sugar
- ½ cups water
- ¾ cup fresh lemon juice
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup heavy cream
- ¼ teaspoon vanilla..
- ¼ cup milk
- Pink Food colouring
- Some Lemon Zest for the top.

### What to do:

1. Gather the ingredients.
2. Dice the rhubarb.
3. Mash the golden kiwi. Take kiwi out carefully so you can use it at the end.
4. Measure the lemon juice, caster sugar, salt, water and food colouring and mix with rhubarb and kiwi into a 2-quart saucepan.
5. Turn on the stove over medium-low heat and let it simmer uncovered, until rhubarb is soft. Cool completely. (If it is too hot then it will ruin the ice cream).
6. Combine rhubarb and kiwi mixture with heavy cream, milk filling ⅓ full and vanilla. Add the pink colouring.
7. Pour into small freezer container
8. Freeze the ice cream in a deep freezer until frozen or cold. Stir the ice cream mixture in between to smooth it out.
9. Sprinkle some lemon zest on top.
10. Put 2 leaves of mint on top
11. Put ice cream into kiwi skins.
12. Serve and enjoy!
