Let Your Light Shine

On Sunday, 13 October, **Cardinal John Henry Newman** and four faithful women were declared Saints. When speaking at the Mass of canonisation, Pope Francis reminded us that Saints are people who recognised their need for God's help, who took risks to discover God's will and to help others, and who nurtured a habit of thanksgiving.

It is important to remember that we are all saints in the making and how we live our Christian lives matters.

During the Mass Pope Francis, quoted Cardinal Newman: "The Christian has a deep, silent, hidden peace, which the world does not. The Christian is cheerful, easy, kind, gentle, courteous, candid, unassuming; has no pretense ...with so little that is unusual or striking in his/her bearing, that he/she may easily be taken at first sight for an ordinary person". Referring to Cardinal Newman's famous hymn "Lead, Kindly Light," the Pope prayed that all Christians "would be kindly lights amid the encircling gloom".

Let us ask God to help us be those "kindly lights". May we strive to truly 'Let Our Lights Shine'

Welcome to school Avery Kameta-Paese and Marios Benyamin who both started in the new entrant class this week.





GARDEN SON TO TABLE GROW, HARVEST, PREPARE, SHARE

Sophia was Chef of the day and explained how the GTT class made summer rolls. Sophia explains "The rice paper had to be put in hot water to soften it. We also had to boil the rice noodles, when they were soft we added some organic oil and soy sauce for flavour. We then put mint, lettuce and rice noodles on top of the rice paper and folded it up. We made a salad with the leftover vegetables which included mint, lettuce, carrot and rice noodles and soy sauce and organic oil." Nu Tha was Gardener of the day. Nu Tha explains what she did "In the garden we made a little pot made from newspaper, the pots are for seed raising. We placed soil and cucumber, tomato and zucchini seeds in the pots. We watered the pots and put them in a tray and we will watch and see if they grow". Maitri and Nu Tha weeded the garden and removed the weeds.
