REMINDERS

At the beginning of each term we like to remind parents of different processes that the school has in place. This week we focus on the process for handling concerns.

It is important that concerns and complaints be handled promptly and professionally in a reasoned, respectful manner. In the first instance, please direct these directly to the person concerned. Serious complaints must be reported to the Principal.

Parental Concerns- Process to be followed by Parents;

- Speak to the class teacher first. It is best to phone or pop in to make a time to speak with the teacher- as sometimes teachers need to go to meetings, go on road patrol etc and may not be immediately available. It is helpful to let the teacher know the nature of the concern or purpose of the meeting- that way the teacher can be prepared for the meeting by having relevant information at hand.
- If you feel your concern has not been adequately addressed speak to the syndicate leader. You will also be required to complete an Incident Report/ Expression of Concern Form prior to this meeting.
- If you feel you need to take your concern further make a time to speak to the principal again follow the procedures outlined above.
- Under no circumstances are parents to discipline the children of other parents.
